# "A Walk in the Stars" Quilt Along - Fall 2023 BLOCK #2 - OHIO STAR BLOCK

<u>NOTE:</u> Go to <u>DKohn Designs on YouTube</u> to find my detailed how-to video for Week #3 – Ohio Star Block (Block #2) for this Quilt Along. BE SURE TO DOWNLOAD THE BLOCK PATTERN BY 11/30/23.

#### **QUILT ALONG SUMMARY**

This quilt is a star block sampler quilt. The block patterns will be released weekly during Sept. and Oct. 2023. Go to my Blog at DKohndesigns.com for the Quilt Along schedule and overall fabric requirements. The block patterns and layout directions are free through Nov. 30, 2023. Beginning Dec. 1, 2023, all of the block patterns will be removed and consolidated into one pattern with the addition of directions for several additional sizes of quilts and then the pattern will be for sale in my Shop at DKohndesigns.com.

BLOCK SIZE: 8" X" unfinished, 7 1/2" finished in the quilt

<u>PATTERN ASSUMPTIONS:</u> 1) 1/4" Seams used throughout the pattern. 2) RST means right sides together. 3) HST means half square triangle. 4) Fat quarters are 18" x 21". 5) Drawings are NOT to scale. 6) Read the entire pattern before cutting fabrics. 7) Arrows indicate pressing direction.

**FABRICS FOR THIS BLOCK:** This block pattern looks best with three different high contrast fabrics. Fat quarters and/or scraps may be used. You will make a total of 4 blocks of Block #2. \*NOTE: For faster assembly, you may want to chain piece sew the half-square triangles for all of the blocks at once.

<b>LETTER</b>	FABRIC/UNIT	1 BLOCK	ALL 4 BLOCKS
Α	Outside corners (background)	4 – 3" sq.	16 – 3" sq.
В	Background of all hourglass units	1 – 4" sq.	4 – 4" sq.
С	Focal fabric #1 of all hourglass units	2 – 4" sq.	8 – 4" sq.
D	Focal fabric #2 of all hourglass units	1 – 4" sq.	4 - 4" sq.
E	Center of star block (may fussy cut if desired)	1 – 3" sq.	4 - 3" sq.

#### **BLOCK CONSTRUCTION FOR ONE BLOCK:**

1) <u>Make the HSTs:</u> A) Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong of all Fabric B AND Fabric D squares. (Fig. 1)

- B) Lay 1 Fabric B square and 1 Fabric C square RST and sew ¼" on both sides of the diagonal line. This will create the 2 triangular pieces. (Fig. 2)
- C) Lay 2nd Fabric C square and 1 Fabric D square RST and sew 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal line. (Fig. 2)

D) Cut in between the two sewn lines of each HST. Cut each stitched layered square in half on the solid cutting line so that you separate the 2 triangular pieces from each square. This will create 2 HST block units from each layered square. (Fig. 3) You will have a total of 2 B/C HSTs and 2 C/D HSTs.

E) Press each HST unit open with seam to the darker fabric. <u>DO NOT TRIM</u> the HSTs yet! Wait until Step 2D below to trim them. (Fig. 4)

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2) <u>Make the Hourglass Units:</u> A) Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner <u>across the seam</u> on the back of both B/C HST units. (Fig. 5)

B) Lay 1 B/C HST unit and 1 C/D HST unit RST and sew 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal line. (Fig. 6)




Fig. 7 – 4 hourglass units

C) Cut each stitched layered HST square unit in half on the solid diagonal cutting line so that you separate the 2 hourglass pieces from each square unit. This will create 2 hourglass units from each layered square unit. Repeat Steps B and C with the remaining B/C HST and C/D HST unit. You will have a total of 4 hourglass units. (Fig. 7)


- D) Trim each hourglass unit to 3" square. (NOTE: If using Clearly Perfect Slotted Trimmer ruler, trim HSTs first, then press open.)
- 3) Assemble the Block: A) Lay out and sew blocks and rows according to Fig. 8 diagram. Be sure to alternate direction of pressed seams for each row (see arrows).

B) When sewing the rows together, press both the top and bottom seams open (see arrows). (Fig. 9)



- 4) Trim the Block: Trim block to 8" unfinished size (7 ½" finished in quilt).
- 5) Make a total of four (4) blocks.

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
